



Taking Metro to Girl Scouts Rock the Mall

No matter how you get to Washington, D.C., the best way to get around the city is to use the Metrorail system! Metrorail provides safe, clean, reliable transit service for more than 700,000 customers a day throughout the Washington, DC area. The system is the second busiest in the United States, serving 86 stations in Virginia, Maryland and the District of Columbia. The Metrorail system has five color-coded rail lines: Red, Orange, Blue, Yellow and Green. The layout of the system makes it possible to travel between any two stations with no more than a single transfer.

Coming from Outside of the Beltway?

Based on the direction from which you approach the city, the chart below shows the best points to enter and exit the Metro system, without transfer, to reach the Washington Monument grounds. Please note - The Smithsonian Metrorail station (Blue Line - on the National Mall) is the closest station to the Washington Monument, but it will likely be closed on June 9th to prevent station overcrowding.
